Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to paragraph 103 of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, Order, and Notice of Inquiry issued in the above-captioned proceedings on April 18, 2013 (“Order”), the Commission required trial participants to begin filing monthly reports sixty days after their initial request for direct access to numbering resources. Millicorp submitted its first report on October 6, 2013 and hereby submits this second report, thirty days thereafter.

On October 4, 2013, Millicorp’s trial numbers went live in LATA 912 (Savannah, GA), and voice testing is continuing. On November 4, 2013, the trial numbers went live in LATA 561 (Boca Raton, FL), and voice testing has been initiated. Millicorp has not been able to reach agreement with CenturyLink in LATA 239 (Fort Myers, FL). CenturyLink was not willing to amend its interconnection agreement with Millicorp’s CLEC partner to deliver PSTN-originated traffic to Millicorp over existing trunks. Instead, CenturyLink has requested that Millicorp purchase dedicated TDM trunks in Fort Myers and enter into a direct agreement with CenturyLink for the exchange of TDM voice traffic. Millicorp will not be able to begin testing numbers in the Fort Myers market until an agreement with CenturyLink is reached.

Millicorp has nothing to report in this report with respect to the specific reporting categories set forth in the Order, which categories include: (i) the total of new numbers placed in service by the provider; (ii) the total number of port-in requests (including current customers) and the percentage of successful ports-in; (iii) the number of requests to port out a number the provider holds directly and the percentage of successful ports-out; (iv) the total number of routing failures, and causes of said failures; and (v) a description of any billing or compensation dispute.
