**WITHDRAWAL OF PETITION FOR TEMPORARY WAIVER OR
TEMPORARY STAY**

Walnut Communications, Inc. (“Walnut”), by its attorney, hereby withdraws without prejudice its “Petition for Temporary Waiver or Temporary Stay” (“Petition”), filed September 26 2013. In support hereof the following is shown:

The Petition sought temporary relief from the requirement contained in Section 20.18(n)(7) of the Rules as it then existed that Walnut provide consumers roaming on its system with an automatic bounce-back message when they attempt to send a text-to-911 message to a Public Safety Answering Point (“PSAP”) that cannot accept 911 text messages. The requirement was scheduled to take effect on September 30, 2013.


The Commission subsequently released its Order on Reconsideration, FCC 13-127, released September 30, 2013 in the referenced dockets amending its text-to-911 regulations in such a way as to render the Petition moot.

WHEREFORE, Walnut hereby withdraws its Petition, without prejudice.
