
I am writing pursuant to Section 1.1206(b)(2) of the Commission's Rules to notify the Commission that on November 13, 2013, Mary L. Brown, Director, Government Affairs of Cisco Systems, Inc. ("Cisco"), Bob Friday, Vice President/Chief Technology Officer for Enterprise Networking Labs - Mobility, part of Cisco's Enterprise Networking Engineering Group, and the undersigned met with Renee Gregory, Legal Advisor to Chairman Tom Wheeler, to discuss the above-referenced proceeding.

Cisco provided an update on the rapid adoption of the IEEE 802.11ac standard by equipment manufacturers around the world and the increasing penetration of IEEE 802.11ac devices into the marketplace. It expressed its strong support for the prompt adoption of an initial Report and Order that would resolve the "low-hanging fruit" in this proceeding, including issues related to harmonizing the rules governing the U-NII-1 band and protection of Terminal Doppler Weather Radar. In addition, Cisco reported on its efforts within the WRC-15 preparatory process regarding the 5350-5470 MHz band and its work with the Dedicated Short Range Communications ("DSRC") community to explore ways in which unlicensed uses and DSRC can share the U-NII-4 band without subjecting DSRC to harmful interference.
