Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Wednesday November 13, 2013, Randall Stephenson, Chairman and CEO of AT&T Jim Cicconi, Executive Senior Vice President, External and Regulatory Affairs, and I met with Commissioner Michael O’Rielly. During the meeting, we discussed the above proceedings.

With respect to the IP Transition proceeding, we urged the Commission to move forward expeditiously with geographic trials on an industry-wide basis and pledged to work with the Commission to achieve an industry-wide efficient and consumer friendly transition to IP technology.


With respect to the Incentive Auction/Spectrum Aggregation proceedings, Mr. Stephenson urged the Commission to create an auction plan that is designed to maximize the amount of spectrum contributed by broadcasters and raise sufficient revenues by auction participants to fund public safety, pay reasonable relocation expenses and compensate contributing broadcasters as required by the statute. We urged that any disincentives or limitations imposed on either the buy side or the sell side should be closely scrutinized. Finally, we noted that reasonable limitations designed to prevent any one entity from acquiring all spectrum available at auction should apply equally to all auction participants, giving all bidders a meaningful opportunity to participate.

With respect to the Leap acquisition, we advised the Chairman that AT&T intended to respond to the FCC's Request for Information promptly and urged the Chairman to move expeditiously to approval of the transaction.

AT&T discussed its proposal that the Commission to oversee comprehensive, geographically-limited trials in preparation for completion of the IP transition, the submission of a plan for executing the trials and its recommendation that the Commission invite other providers to develop and file trial plans for locations in their serving areas.
