Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 18, 2013, Silver Star Telephone Company, Inc. (Silver Star) provided information to Julie Veach of the Wireline Competition Bureau (WCB) concerning the data in the ESRI StreetMap with respect to road miles and road crossings and the difficulty in being able to update the data.

Specifically, Silver Star informed Ms. Veach of its understanding that most of the information provided in StreetMap, at one time or another, has been purchased by ESRI and then redistributed through their product. DeLorme and NAVTEQ appear to provide most of the road information to ESRI. Further, it is Silver Star's understanding that there is not a direct way to update the road maps with ESRI. However, it may be possible to work with NAVTEQ in updating their road maps prior to ESRI receiving them.

It is Silver Star's understanding that it could take between 6 months and 18 months to get updates into StreetMap. It is Silver Star's understanding that Silver Star would have to update NAVTEQ and then wait for their updates to be released. ESRI would pick up the NAVTEQ data after its release and incorporate that into StreetMap.

Silver Star's review of the StreetMap 10.2 update shows that while it appears to be better and updated from previous versions, it still has missing and incorrect data.

Finally, it is Silver Star's understanding that Tele Atlas may be an alternative source of road data.
