⊙ or ⊚ --Represents homes passed, but not currently able to access the network.

Note- the red lines represents BTOP funded fiber route to a Community Anchor Institution. Although current homes passed cannot access the network, Troy Cable anticipates spending non-federal funds in 1<sup>st</sup> Q 2014 to connect homes passed which was not an allowable expense under the BTOP Grant.

#### Note:

The Southeast Alabama SmartBand Project allows Troy Cable to construct a fiber infrastructure capable of serving subscribers with a minimum Broadband service speed of 4 Mbps downstream and 1 Mbps upstream (“4/1”). Troy Cable’s Grant will be complete on or before December 31, 2013. All construction and routes completed under this Grant will have services available to subscribers along the designated routes within the challenged areas. BTOP funding is related to the fiber infrastructure and the connection to community anchor institutions as well as business along the routes. Although, residences will not be physically connected using BTOP funds, the homes passed or potential subscribers would not be capable of receiving services in the unserved or underserved areas without the infrastructure being built as a result of the BTOP Project. Troy Cable has and will continue connecting any homes passed or subscribers along those routes. The fiber infrastructure built will be marketed and available to all subscribers along said routes.

In addition to the awarded BTOP Project, Troy Cable is a recipient of the *Broadband Adoption Lifeline Pilot Program, WC Docket No. 11-42*. As part of this Program, Troy Cable agreed to provide a minimum Broadband speed of 4/1. In February 2013, Troy Cable moved all existing customers who were not receiving this minimum threshold to the 4/1 speed at no additional charge to the customer. Troy Cable’s lowest available internet service speed tier is 4/1.
