This is to inform you that on November 21, 2013, Matthew Zinn, Senior Vice President, General Counsel, Secretary & Chief Privacy Officer, TiVo Inc. ("TiVo") and the undersigned met with Philip Verveer, Senior Counselor to Chairman Tom Wheeler.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the Petitions filed by TiVo in the above-captioned proceedings. We discussed the arguments set forth in the Petition for Rulemaking filed by TiVo on July 16, 2013. We urged the Commission to act expeditiously in order to remove uncertainty regarding the Commission's CableCARD rules following the D.C. Circuit's *EchoStar* decision, and to provide consumers and retail manufacturers with certainty that navigation devices purchased at retail will continue to receive cable signals that consumers have subscribed to. We also discussed the need for a successor conditional access solution to assure the availability of bidirectional video signals to retail devices pursuant to Section 629, but emphasized that the CableCARD solution, which is fully realized today, must remain in place until a successor standard is in place. In addition, we summarized the arguments made by

TiVo in its Petition for Reconsideration of the Memorandum Opinion and Order (DA 13-788, released April 18, 2013) granting a waiver to Charter Communications, Inc.
