On Thursday, November 21, 2013, Joan Marsh, , Michael Goggin, Alex Starr and the undersigned of AT&T Services, Inc. (AT&T), David Lawson of Sidley and Austin, LLC and Michael Kearns and Lili Dworkin of the University of Pennsylvania met via teleconference with Gary Epstein and Edward Smith of the Incentive Auctions Task Force, Brett Tarnutzer, Jonathan McCormack and Sasha Javid of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, Evan Kwerel of the Office of Strategic Planning, Kevin Leyton Brown and Ilya Segal of Auctionomics, Inc., and Karla Hoffman of Decisive Analytics.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the methodology employed by Mr. Kearns and Ms. Dworkin to study the repacking issues related to the incentive auction proceeding. The methodology uses the data released by the Commission on July 22nd, 2013 to evaluate possible scenarios for spectrum clearing and repacking in the course of the auction. The goal is to develop a data driven tool for evaluating different scenarios that can then be used to estimate spectrum availability at different levels of broadcaster participation.
