Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 19, 2013, James Arden Barnett, Jr. of the law firm Venable LLP, attorney representing TruePosition, Inc., a member of the Find Me 911 Coalition, met with David Goldman, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Rosenworcel, at the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC").

The meeting was convened on behalf of TruePosition, Inc. to thank Commissioner Rosenworcel for her leadership and strong testimony on the issue of indoor location accuracy at the FCC Oversight Hearing on December 12, 2013. Further, Mr. Barnett expressed his thoughts on problems with the accuracy of the fall-back technologies of RTT and AFLT when Assisted GPS does not work. He also discussed that the reliance on LTE and OTDOA incorporates an unacceptable 5-7 year waiting period with an unproven technology. Mr. Barnett urged that the FCC treat this as an urgent public safety problem since there are millions of wireless 911 calls each year which will go without an accurate location. Mr. Barnett also stressed that the FCC should adopt a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, as soon as possible.
