
SUPPORT OF FM TRANSLATORS FOR AM LICENSEES

That, Seehafer agrees that the Commission should open an "FM Translator Filing Window" exclusively for AM licensees and permittees. Seehafer also agrees that each translator should be 'locked' into the AM license, so the two may not be sold off, individually. Seehafer admits that this part of the FCC's initiative is not really 'AM Improvement' but an 'olive branch' extended to small market AM broadcasters and especially smaller AM radio stations, who need help. Seehafer would apply for, and if granted, would construct and operate FM translators for our three AM stations, namely, WOMT-AM Manitowoc, WI; WFHR-AM, Wisconsin Rapids, WI and WDLB-AM Marshfield, WI.

We thank the Commission for taking a serious review of problems which affect AM broadcasters today, and look forward to improvements that will help thousands of AM broadcasters, today.
