This letter revises and clarifies our letter dated November 12, 2013, in response to your correspondence dated October 25, 2013, with an enclosed Public Notice and Program Comment for Planned Construction of Positive Train Control Facilities Within the Railroad Bed, WT Docket No. 13-240.

In our November 12, 2013, letter the Hopi Cultural Preservation Office stated we understood the "Positive Train Control" Program will require installation of more than 20,000 wayside poles and other facilities alongside railroad tracks across the nation, and that we appreciated the FCC's efforts to facilitate an effective National Historic Preservation Act process for the program through the development of a Program Comment.

Regarding the FCC's Tower Construction Notification System for communications tower construction, we stated our area of interest is four counties in Arizona, Yavapai, Coconino, Apache, and Navajo. Regarding the proposed Program Comment we hereby revise and clarify our November 12, 2013, letter regarding Planned Construction of Positive Train Control Facilities to be consistent with this area of interest, Yavapai, Coconino, Apache, and Navajo Counties in Arizona.
