This letter addresses the Commission's pending consideration of the use of cell phones on normal airline flights. I have never addressed an issue before any regulatory commission before.

I have flown many thousands of miles, military and commercial, foreign and domestic, in the course of my professional life. I believe the Commission should consider the possibility for disorder on flights where any cellphone consumer who can afford the price of the service may use that service without reservation or restraint.

The nature of travel, even in business class, has degenerated into a cacophony of self-assertion which only calms down well into the flight. The use of cellphones during this period will only perpetuate the anger and irritation and extend it for the whole flight.

As I study the existing public comment on this issue, I find one phrase decisive—"Alec Baldwin." I do not believe the Commission should approve a service which the general public can only interpret as a concession to the airline's ceaseless desire for marginal profit at the expense of passengers as a whole.
