As a frequent traveler both domestically and internationally, I am AGAINST expanding access to mobile wireless service onboard aircraft (13-301), specifically as it relates to voice calls. Data access, texting, and other "silent" activities are fine because they do not infringe on the rights and space of others. Having dozens on people talking loudly into their cell phones, with no escape for the other passengers, would be torturous and likely increase the number of passenger to passenger conflicts and incidents on airplanes. What is the difference between those actions and talking on a cell phone? Silence is golden, especially in an enclosed and confined space like an airplane.
