**MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME**

The National Association of Broadcasters (NAB)<sup>1</sup> hereby requests that the Federal Communications Commission grant an extension of the deadline for the submission of comments in response to the above-captioned Public Notice.<sup>2</sup> Comments are currently due on January 27, 2014. NAB respectfully requests a one-week extension of the deadline to file the comments, until Monday, February 3, 2014.

NAB requests this very brief extension to ensure that it, and other interested parties, are able to respond fully to all questions raised in the *Notice*. NAB and its members are currently working diligently on a sister docket before the Consumer and Government Affairs Bureau on improving the quality of closed captioning and Electronic Newsroom Technique (ENT) captioning, in conjunction with the Media Bureau, consumer

groups, and other stakeholders.<sup>3</sup> Due to the closely related subject matter, the same individuals at NAB and its member stations are needed to work on both the captioning quality and ENT proceeding and on the proceeding addressing captioning of video clips. A reasonable delay of one week, until February 3, will provide the additional time needed for the Commission and all other stakeholders, including NAB, to continue their collaborative work on quality captioning and ENT. A delay also will allow NAB to conduct a more thorough review of broadcasters' use of online video clips while responding to the questions in the *Notice*.

Accordingly, NAB requests a one week extension of the deadline for filing initial comments in response to the *Notice*.
