Support for NAB’s Motion for Extension of Time

Telecommunications for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Inc. (TDI), the National Association of the Deaf (NAD), Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA), the Association of Late-Deafened Adults (ALDA), the Cerebral Palsy and Deaf Organization (CPADO), the American Association of the Deaf-Blind (AADB), the California Coalition of Agencies Serving the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCASDHH), and the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Consumer Advocacy Network (DHHCAN), collectively, “Consumer Groups,” joined by the Technology Access Program at Gallaudet University (TAP), respectfully support the January 17, 2014 motion of the National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) to extend the January 27, 2014 deadline for public comments on the application of the Commission’s Internet Protocol (“IP”) closed captioning rules to video clips by one week to February 3, 2014.¹ We agree with NAB that the proposed extension will provide additional time for stakeholders to provide more detailed and thorough information in response to the Commission’s inquiry, and believe that the proposed extension is sufficiently short that it will not prejudice the public interest. Accordingly, we support NAB’s proposed extension.
