I would like to voice my concerns for Verizon Wireless continuing to prevent Google's Nexus line devices from accessing its network. While I understand that technically not all devices are created equally in terms of accessible frequencies and compatibility, there are no actual documented reasons why Verizon will not support the Nexus 7 or 5 on their network.

The FCC C Block standard of 700 MHz spectrum does "recognize that this obligation only applies in the case of devices that comply with the provider's published technical standards," (47 C.F.R. § 27.16(b)) and "use their own certification standards and processes to approve use of devices and applications on their networks so long as those standards are confined to reasonable network management." This should not allow a service provider to slow the certification process to a speed considered complacent by the general public and should instead carry it out in an immediate and fair timeline made publicly available.

Verizon as an organization should strive to set a standard of interoperability to allow our nation to excel technologically and advance to a true "internet of things". The FCC should do all things in its ability to encourage this process and guide them in advancing the standard of technology for our nation.
