On January 16, 2014, Inteliquent, Inc.'s ("Inteliquent") John Harrington, Senior Vice President, Litigation, Regulatory, & Human Resources, and Ian Neale, Vice President and General Manager, and Ronald W. Del Sesto Jr., Partner, and Edward Kirsch, Of Counsel, of Bingham McCutchen LLP met with Jonathan Sallet, Acting General Counsel, Henning Schulzrinne, Chief Technologist, Jonathan Chambers, Chief Office of Strategic Planning & Policy Analysis ("OSP"), William Dever, Division Chief Wireline Competition Bureau ("WCB") Competition Policy Division ("CPD"), Ann Stevens Deputy Division Chief (WCB CPD), Richard Hovey (WCB CPD), and Patrick Halley (WCB), on behalf of the Commission's Technology Transitions Policy Task Force ("Task Force"). We also held a series of separate meetings with the following people: Daniel Alvarez, Legal Advisor to Chairman Wheeler, Nicholas Degani, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Pai, Amy Bender, Legal Advisor to Commissioner O'Reilly, and Christianna Lewis Barnhart, Acting Legal Advisor to Commissioner Rosenworcel. In addition, on January 17, 2014, Mr. Harrington and Mr. Del Sesto had a telephone conference with Rebekah Goodheart, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Clyburn to discuss issues in the above referenced proceedings.

During these meetings and conversations, Inteliquent discussed a number of subjects. Inteliquent explained that it is an alternative tandem provider with broad geographic reach that makes it easier for CLECs, ILECs, cable companies and other providers to connect indirectly on an IP basis. Inteliquent noted that it has extensive direct connections with competitive carrier switches. Inteliquent discussed its potential role in facilitating the IP transition, particularly with respect to IP interconnection. Inteliquent noted that it, and other carriers, have the ability to perform TDM to SIP conversions and *vice versa* between carriers that, for whatever reason, do not engage in
