FCC Chairman Wheeler, Commissioners Clyburn, Rosenworcel and Pai

As a frequent flyer I request you vote no on allowing cell access on planes. Allowing the airlines to decide to allow wireless cell communication on a plane is a slippery slope to people making voice calls. Many airline providers are already installing WIFI access on a plane and the only reason I can see to add cell access would be to make phone voice calls. I equate this decision to allowing the airlines to determine if they would allow smoking sections on a plane. Allowing phone call access on plane while not a direct health hazard like smoking, would be a governmental endorsement to make a cell phone call while on a plane.
