Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 22, 2014, Robert Quinn, Henry Hultquist, Christopher Heimann, and the undersigned of AT&T met with Rebekah Goodheart, Wireline Legal Advisor to Commissioner Clyburn, in connection with the above-captioned matters.

AT&T discussed its January 21, 2014 proposal<sup>1</sup> that the FCC consider a two-stage process when transitioning customers to IP-based services in a geographically- limited area as part of the proposed technology transitions experiments it is scheduled to discuss at its January Open Meeting. As outlined in that proposal, separate section 214 applications would be filed for each stage. The first section 214 application would seek approval to allow existing customers to continue receiving their existing TDM-based services while requiring new orders for service to be provisioned using IP-based and wireless successor services. The second application would seek approval to withdraw the interstate TDM-based services for existing customers. Under this process the FCC would have the opportunity to evaluate the results of the experiment before granting any participating carrier approval to proceed with the next stage.
