Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 28, 2014, I spoke by telephone with Sanford Williams, Wireline Competition Bureau, FCC, on behalf of Telcordia Technologies, Inc. (d/b/a iconectiv) to urge the Commission to direct the NANC Selection Working Group (“SWG”) and the Future of NPAC Subcommittee of the NAPM LLC (“FoNPAC”) to publicly post an updated LNPA procurement timeline as soon as possible. The timeline currently posted on the NAPM LLC’s NPAC LNPA procurement page provides that the FCC would have approved the vendor selection recommendations for all regions on approximately January 20, 2014.<sup>1</sup> That date has now passed, and no information has been made public regarding revisions to the timeline or an updated award date. Prospective vendors other than the incumbent need to be apprised of the now-operative schedule in order to be able to plan for implementation.

Publicly posting an updated procurement timeline is a straightforward process. In fact, the FoNPAC has previously posted an updated timeline during this procurement process. The timeline included in the original RFP documents released in February 2013 provided for FCC approval of vendor selection to occur in September 2013.


