In a December 20, 2013 letter concerning reforming the Federal Communication Commission's real-party-in-interest disclosure requirements, the word "time" was inadvertently omitted from the second sentence on page 3 of the letter. This sentence should read: "At the same *time*, these proposals would still leave substantial room for interested parties to coordinate 'astro-turf' campaigns where a single company or organization supplies financial support to other organizations to give the impression of widespread support for a particular proposal."
