On January 30, 2014, Terri Natoli of Time Warner Cable, David Don of Comcast Corp., Emmett O'Keefe of Cablevision Systems Corp., and I met with Louis Peraertz, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Clyburn, and Erin McGrath, Legal Advisor to Commissioner O'Rielly. On January 31, 2014, Ms. Natoli, Mr. Don, Rick Chessen of the National Cable & Telecommunications Association ("NCTA"), and I met with Jeffrey Neumann, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Pai; Mr. Don, Mr. Chessen and I also met with Renee Gregory, Legal Advisor to Chairman Wheeler. On February 3, 2014, Ms. Natoli, Mr. Don, Mr. O'Keefe, Mr. Chessen and I met with David Goldman and Alison Neplokh, Legal Advisors to Commissioner Rosenworcel. In all five meetings, we urged the Commission to move forward with an Order on the U-NII-1 Band. We discussed the topics described in the January 22, 2014 NCTA filing in this proceeding, specifically describing the University of Colorado/CableLabs technical analysis and dynamic simulation contained in that filing.
