On February 12, 2014 Joan Marsh and I, from AT&T Services, Inc. (AT&T), met with Matthew Berry, Chief of Staff for Commission Pai's Office, to discuss the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking for Improving Wireless E911 Location Accuracy scheduled for the February Open Meeting agenda. At the meeting, we indicated our continued strong support for public safety issues and expressed that the time was right to begin discussing Indoor Location Accuracy for E911.

We also stated that FCC should be careful to ensure that any proposed rules on location accuracy are aligned with proven capabilities of the current state of technology and they should set realistic accuracy benchmarks that the industry and public safety can embrace. The FCC should continue to look to the Communications Security, Reliability, and Interoperability Council (CSRIC) for guidance on the indoor location accuracy benchmarks. Finally, we noted that the partnership between the industry and the public safety community has been highly successful in resolving public safety issues in the past, and it remains the best approach for resolving the indoor location accuracy issues raised in the upcoming proceeding.
