Dear Ms. Dortch,

On Tuesday, February 11, 2014, S. Douglas Hutcheson, President and Chief Executive Officer, and Robert Irving, Senior Vice President and General Counsel, of Leap Wireless International, Inc., and Cricket Communications, Inc., and the undersigned (together, the “Leap Representatives”), met with Roger Sherman, Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau (“WTB”), along with James Schlichting and Susan Singer of the WTB, and Hillary Burchuk of the Office of General Counsel.

In this meeting, the Leap Representatives (i) briefed the Commission representatives on the current status of the Leap business and its attendant challenges, (ii) expressed their view that the reasons for entering into the transaction remained sound, and that approval of the transaction was in the public interest, and (iii) urged that the Commission proceed to approve the transaction promptly and within the boundaries of its informal 180-day “shot clock.” The Leap Representatives also noted that Cricket’s request for a waiver of Section 27.60 of the Commission’s rules recently appeared on public notice, and that Cricket looked forward to working with the Commission to free up more critically-needed wireless capacity for LTE operations in the densely populated market of Chicago, while also readily coexisting with Channel 51 terrestrial broadcast operations in that market and causing no harmful interference to such operations.
