On Wednesday, February 12, 2014, Justin Faulb of the National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) spoke with Jeffrey Neumann, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Pai.

The purpose of the call was to discuss closed captioning quality on television,¹ including the use of Electronic Newsroom Technique (ENT). Our discussion was consistent with NAB's previous meetings.² In addition, I inquired as to the status of any pending sunshine notice given the impending snow storm forecast for Thursday, February 13.

I thanked Mr. Neumann for Commissioner Pai's efforts to ensure a balanced order as broadcasters work with all stakeholders to improve captioning quality and availability.
