**Re: Notice of *Ex Parte* Presentation in Amendment of Parts 1, 2, 22, 24, 27, 90 and 95 of the Commission's Rules to Improve Wireless Coverage Through the Use of Signal Boosters, WT Docket No. 10-4.**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On February 12, 2014, Sean Haynberg of V-COMM, L.L.C., David Kilian of Verizon Wireless, and Frank Jager and Andy Lachance, both of Verizon, had a telephone conversation with Tom Derenge, Joyce Jones and Moslem Sawez of the FCC's Wireless Telecommunications Bureau to discuss issues raised in the Petition for Reconsideration filed jointly by V-COMM, Verizon Wireless and Wilson Electronics in the above-captioned proceeding.<sup>1</sup>

Verizon and V-COMM explained that the higher noise and gain limits allowed for provider specific consumer signal boosters will cause harmful interference if the Commission continues to permit such boosters to be operated in mobile environments. This interference will affect adjacent channel licensees and co-channel licensees in adjacent markets.<sup>2</sup> To alleviate this problem, if the Commission continues to permit provider specific consumer boosters to be used in mobile

environments, the provider specific consumer signal booster rules must be amended to apply the same noise and gain limits that apply to wideband mobile consumer boosters.<sup>3</sup>
