In the meeting, EdLiNC expressed its opinion that proposals to further limit the number of times that applicants can apply for Priority II funding in a five-year period may not allow more applicants to gain access to those funds and may wreak havoc with school and library budgets. Additionally, EdLiNC expressed strong reservations about proposals to institute per pupil caps, stating that it would disadvantage rural applicants. EdLiNC also expressed concerns about diverting already limited program funds to pilots or for administrative or consulting services that are not actual telecommunications services.
