Amendment of the Commission's Rules with Regard to Commercial Operations in the 1695-1710 MHz, 1755-1780 MHz, and 2155-2180 MHz Bands

On February 28, 2014, Douglas C. Smith, CEO; Janice Obuchowski, and Jay Chauhan, representing Oceus Networks Inc. ("Oceus Networks"), met with Julius Knapp, Chief, Office of Engineering & Technology (OET); John Leibovitz, Deputy Chief, Wireless Bureau; Ira Keltz, Deputy Chief, OET; Ronald Repasi, Deputy Chief, OET; Mark Settle, Chief, Policy and Rules Division, OET; Bryant Wellman, OET; and Garth Hahn, OET.

During the meeting, representatives from Oceus Networks provided an update on the company's work adapting commercial wireless technologies for its military customers and growing interest in its deployable solutions by the first responder community. Representatives from Oceus Networks discussed the progress the company has made in delivering 4G LTE solutions to these user groups.

Oceus Networks identified how a bi-directional sharing framework that provides access by military users to the band pairing, 1755-1780 MHz and 2155-2180 MHz, could fulfill training requirements on remote bases and ranges with limited impact to auction revenues. Representatives from Oceus Networks also highlighted the strong policy momentum on sharing in the past year.
