**Re: Notice of Ex Parte Presentation: WT Docket 13-193: Applications of Cricket License Company, LLC, et al., Leap Wireless International, Inc., and AT&T Inc. for Consent To Transfer Control of Authorizations**

Dear Ms. Dortch,

We have just noticed AT&T's filing<sup>1</sup>, a few days before the shot clock expires, in which it offers a typical set of commitments to take effect upon the closing of this transaction. A rapid review of these commitments shows that consistent with AT&T's usual practice it has included a number of escape clauses that will enable it to avoid having to implement any conditions with significant impact on the harm that this transaction will cause as we have already delineated and demonstrated and they have not refuted.

In view of this timing we request an extension of or stoppage of the shot clock in order to give us and other opponents of this transaction time to respond to this last minute attempt by AT&T to pressure the FCC into reaching a decision that in practice will fulfill all its goals while not mitigating the damage this transaction will cause.
