On March 11, 2014, Mary L. Henze, Anisa Latif, and Cathy Carpino (via phone) met with members of the Wireline Competition Bureau and the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau. Participating from the FCC were Kim Scardino, Vickie Robinson, Garnet Hanly, Jonathan Lechter, Anita Panker-Stoll, Susan Singer, John Schauble, AJ Glusman and Nese Guendelsberger. On March 12, Ms. Carpino and I spoke again (via phone) with Ms. Scardino, Ms. Robinson, Ms. Hanly and Ms. Singer.

The purpose of the meeting and subsequent call was to discuss the post-close treatment of Cricket Communications, Inc. ("Cricket") existing Lifeline-only ETC designations. AT&T indicated that, as it has done in prior transactions, it would maintain Cricket's ETC designations for some period of time. As such, Cricket will continue to fulfill its Lifeline ETC obligations and comply with relevant requirements. Should Cricket decide to cease participating in the Lifeline program, it would comply with applicable procedures to effectuate such a decision (including applicable relinquishment procedures).
