Commission's reforms should recognize that digital learning not only requires a broadband connection to each school, but also the infrastructure within the school that can deliver the bandwidth and technology that meet each classroom's needs. We believe that, in the near future, the majority of connections to that infrastructure likely will be through Wi-Fi enabled devices. Wi-Fi access points and network cabling are important components of delivering broadband access to classrooms and should be funded through E-rate. Currently, these items fall under the "denied" Priority 2 list of eligible goods and services. Please reconsider the decision to deny Priority 2 funding requests.
