Re: Notice of Ex Parte Communication: *Amendment of the Commission's Rules with Regard to Commercial Operations in the 3550-3650 MHz Band*, GN Docket No. 12-354

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On April 3, 2014, Milo Medin, Johanna Shelton, and I, of Google Inc., met with Renee Gregory, Legal Advisor to Chairman Wheeler. We discussed the FCC's proposal to open the 3550-3700 MHz band for sharing by commercial users. We urged that the Commission adopt rules for the band that are consistent with the following principles:

- Adherence to the three-tiered framework proposed by the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology (PCAST);
- Broad eligibility for the secondary (priority access) tier of users;
- General authorized access wherever priority access reservations are not in use;
- Designation of priority access reservation areas that match, as closely as possible, the boundaries of actual spectrum use;
- Management by a spectrum access database;
- Calculation of exclusion zones based on small-cell deployment and to protect only federal users rather than commercial entrants; and
- Lightweight, fast, and flexible auction mechanisms where mutually exclusivity cannot otherwise be avoided by voluntary mechanisms such as technical coordination.
