My name is Darren Sussman and I am the owner of Reid Sound, Inc. We are an audio-visual service provider located in New Jersey. We service primarily the New Jersey, New York, and Philadelphia area, but are often called on to work nationwide. We use a great deal of audio and video equipment in the course of providing services to our clients, but one of the main pieces of equipment we use is wireless microphone and monitoring systems. Whether we are providing audio for a political rally, a corporate meeting, or a high school musical, wireless microphone systems are integral to our ability to provide a high quality service to our customers.

Recently, Sennheiser Electronics has proposed that auction winners in the upcoming 600MHz auction be required to compensate wireless microphone owners for any equipment that they will not be able to use after the spectrum repacking. As a small business owner who has made a large investment in wireless microphone equipment, I fully support this proposal. Not only will my business suffer if I am forced to replace inventory that has been rendered useless, but my clients who have purchased wireless microphone technology (many of whom are churches or schools without significant room in their budgets) will also be forced to suffer an expense that will put an unfair burden on them.

I urge you to consider and support Sennheiser Electronics' proposal.
