The Dynamic Spectrum Alliance (DSA) supports the issuance of a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking by the Commission in order to develop a more complete record concerning the feasibility of sharing the 10.0-10.5 GHz band among federal, amateur, and fixed and mobile users, the potential new commercial uses of the band, and the rules to enable both. The capability to share underutilized spectrum is one way to meet the skyrocketing demand for both fixed and mobile wireless broadband.
