How is it that the FCC's previous net neutrality rules were deemed invalid by the courts based on a finding that the FCC had simply failed to claim the necessary authority to establish those rules? And, how is it that, having failed to simply claim that authority and reestablish those previous rules, the FCC has instead enacted new rules which undermine net neutrality? How is it that the FCC has the authority to enact such rules now but lacked that authority - through its own failure to claim that authority - previously?
