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One significant concern I have regarding the potential impact the current planned decision will have on the Internet is that the decision is based on the Internet today, and in today's world. The decision is such that it will be unsuccessful if it is not revisited, if the provider(s) do not meet the spirit of the ruling, but still comply with the existing language.

The decision made today needs to be greater than this. The decision needs to be crafted in such a manner that there is no need to revisit it in the future, with no assumption on the temperament or behavior of the carrier providing the service. Such a decision will stand. The current planned decision will make the existing internet obsolete, as there will be other providers that currently use the internet that will be motivated to use other primary delivery methods; there will be Countries willing to sponsor development that will obviate the current dominance of the Internet in today's communication.

There is not a single resource on the internet that could not in theory be provided by a different method of delivery. If there is not complete net neutrality, there will be those that will have a purpose to develop other delivery methods. Technology will always improve. If the internet is not completely and unmistakably a level playing field for all, then it will limit it's value as the underlying resource. That limit will be the downfall of the Internet. Please consider the long-term limitations this decision may bring to the Internet.
