NOTICE OF DISCONTINUANCE

To all residents of CT. This may or may not apply to you. Pending state and regulatory approval where applicable, on or after May 15, 2014, The Southern New England Telephone Company d/b/a AT&T Connecticut and SNET America Inc., d/b/a AT&T Long Distance East will no longer offer Calling Card service throughout the United States, The District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, American Samoa and all International countries.

The FCC will normally authorize this proposed discontinuance of service (or reduction or impairment) unless it is shown that customers would be unable to receive service or a reasonable substitute from another carrier or that the public convenience and necessity is otherwise adversely affected. If you wish to object, you should file your comments as soon as possible, but no later than 15 days after the Commission releases public notice of the proposed discontinuance. Address them to the Federal Communication Commission, Wireline Competition Bureau, Competition Policy Division, Washington, DC 20554, and include in your comments a reference to the 63.71 Application of SNET America Inc., d/b/a AT&T Long Distance East. Comments should include specific information about the impact of this proposed discontinuance (or reduction or impairment) upon you or your company, including any inability to acquire reasonable substitute service. You may contact the CT Public Utilities Regulatory Authority, 10 Franklin Sq., New Britain, CT 06051, 800.382.4586 regarding service within CT.


