There is no national value added by allowing ISPs to charge content providers for fast lane status. It will serve only to enrich the ISPs while providing an overall reduction in service quality for the consumer and other content providers. I am strongly in favor of Open Internet rules.

I understand that the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit vacated and remanded parts of the Commission's Open Internet rules, ruling that the Open Internet rules represented impermissible common carrier regulation of an information service. If the internet is reclassified as a common carrier, Open Internet rules will be allowable. Given that most of my communication on a daily basis involves the internet, and not historically classified common carriers, this reclassification of the internet can be easily justified and should be done, making Open Internet rules allowable.
