Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Tuesday, May 6, 2014, Dean Brenner and the undersigned from QUALCOMM Incorporated (“Qualcomm”) met with the FCC staff members listed below to discuss the above-referenced proceeding. Qualcomm discussed the comments, reply comments, and proposed rules that it filed in response to the NPRM, and described how the proposed system will protect GSO satellite systems as well as future NGSO satellite systems that may be deployed in the 14.0 to 14.5 GHz band.

Also, Qualcomm explained that the parameters it proposed in its December 11, 2013 filing would provide more than adequate protection for incumbent users of the spectrum and enable a viable Air-Ground Mobile Broadband Service to be successfully deployed on a secondary basis in the band. Qualcomm also asked the agency to allocate two licenses in the lower and upper 250 MHz portions of the band.

Finally, Qualcomm encouraged the Commission to issue a Report and Order authorizing the Air-Ground Mobile Broadband Service on a secondary licensed basis in the 14.0-14.5 GHz band as soon as possible.
