Comcast and Time Warner should not be allowed to merge as this would tremendously decrease any current, and potential for future, competition in the fields of cable tv providers and high-speed internet providers.

Where I live (Boston, Back Bay) Comcast has the monopole for cable tv AND high-speed (cable) Internet. The service is sometimes good, other times (like in 2013 for me) unacceptable (with lack of Internet connection most of every day, and the speed slows to a crawl when many tenants in the building are using it - yet we pay the same, very high price).

But as there is no choice, Comcast INCREASES THE PRICE EVERY 6 MONTHS (or 12 months at most). For bundled landline phone + basic cable + Internet high-speed connection into my apartment I used to pay \$100 per month 1.5 years ago, \$125/month a year ago, \$150/month 6 months ago, and now \$175/month. And this with no change in service. This is unacceptable. Giving more clout to Comcast would be absolutely terrible for US consumers, for new business ventures, and the spirit of innovation in the US.
