Dear Ms. Dortch,

This letter is to advise you, in accordance with the Commission's rules, that on May 6, 2014, I spoke over the phone with Nicholas Degani, Commissioner Pai's Legal Advisor for Wireline issues.

The substance of my presentation was fully consistent with the petition submitted by Mozilla to the Commission on May 5, 2014, also filed in the above Commission dockets. Specifically, we discussed the statutory definition of telecommunications services and past precedential Commission orders interpreting those precedents, as well as how the statute and those precedents are interpreted in the Mozilla petition. We also discussed regulatory history and market evolution in the Internet ecosystem and specifically for broadband Internet access services. Finally, we discussed substantive issues around blocking and prioritization, including the differences between paid prioritization, which Mozilla has expressed its opposition to), and possible specialized services, as discussed in the evolution of the Commission's 2010 *Open Internet Order*, which by virtue of their technical segregation from Internet access services present a distinct legal and policy analysis.
