Dear Ms. Dortch,

This letter is to advise you, in accordance with the Commission's rules, that on May 8, 2014, I spoke over the phone with Priscilla Argeris, Commissioner Rosenworcel's Legal Advisor for Wireline issues.

The substance of my presentation was fully consistent with the petition submitted by Mozilla to the Commission on May 5, 2014, also filed in the above Commission dockets. Specifically, we discussed the role of network management technologies in the context of the petition's treatment of technical and market evolution in Internet access services. We discussed substantive and procedural intersections between the Mozilla petition and the open proceeding on adopting rules to protect the open Internet, including the forthcoming Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, as well as ways to support open Internet rules through Title II authority. I contended that the Mozilla petition represents a legally, and practically, viable path forward for the Commission to anchor effective open Internet rules, including no blocking, nondiscrimination, and no paid prioritization applicable to fixed and mobile Internet access services.
