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I am opposed to a toll structure for internet bandwidth supported by my ISP.

I already pay my ISP a premium for high speed (18mbps DSL) equal access to all sites I wish to visit.

Many sites I visit are only available because advertisers and or benefactors cover the cost of placing the content on line.

As I understand this proposition, my ISP will be allowed to sell bandwidth to the highest bidder. ANY bidder will have preference over my most valued providers such as PBS, NPR, Wikipedia, Google,

I already donate to non-profit content providers. I do not use any pay for content sites.

As much as what is proposed will slow my access to preferred content, I do not see any public good in exchange.

The FCC has failed to make a case for the public good.
