Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Wednesday, May 7, 2014, Jessica Gonzalez, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, Alejandro Gonzalez-Tate, intern, and I on behalf of the the National Hispanic Media Coalition ("NHMC") and Mark Potok, Senior Fellow, Southern Poverty Law Center ("SPLC"), met with Clint Odom, Policy Director for Commissioner Rosenworcel. In a separate meeting, on the same day, NHMC and SPLC representatives met with Adonis Hoffman, Chief of Staff and Senior Legal Advisor, and Stefanie Frank, legal fellow, of Commissioner Clyburn's office.

In both meetings, NHMC and SPLC discussed NHMC's 2009 Petition for Inquiry into the prevalence of hate speech in the media and the relationship between hate speech and hate crimes.<sup>1</sup>

Further, NHMC representatives discussed the above captioned proceedings. NHMC expressed the belief that the Commission must reclassify the transmission component of Internet access service as a Title II Telecommunications service in order to implement effective and sustainable open Internet rules. Further, NHMC conveyed the opinion that any rules that allow for blocking, discrimination, or paid prioritization will fail to protect and preserve the open Internet.
