I'm writing to express my concern over any rules which allow Internet providers to charge fees for faster service. Under the proposed rules, companies would have an incentive to provide the worst service they legally can to their customers, in order to extort the highest payments they can from web sites and other companies transmitting data through the Internet. Net Neutrality has the benefit of encouraging Internet providers to improve service to their customers, in order to attract more customers; any proposal which could make revenue from non-customers more important than revenue from customers threatens to undermine whatever benefit the free market might provide to consumers. Moreover, there is no advantage to the consumer: the fees you propose to allow Internet companies to provide are pure parasitism, providing no economic advantage to either customers or the businesses which are compelled to make these payments.
