Dear Ms. Dortch:

In accordance with Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, we hereby provide you with notice of an oral ex parte presentation in connection with the above-captioned proceedings. On May 12, 2014, the undersigned spoke by phone with Louis Peraertz, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Mignon Clyburn at his request.

During the call, I clarified our position on the potential use of 600 MHz spectrum by wireless carriers. We believe 600 MHz is likely to be the first spectrum band where carriers will deploy 5G service in the United States and that a failure by a carrier such as U.S. Cellular to obtain sufficient 600 MHz spectrum could materially limit our ability to deploy 5G services to our existing customer base within a competitive timeframe. I also indicated that we believe it is important for us to obtain at least two 5X5 blocks of 600 MHz spectrum.
