I work in Internet services, so my job (and thousands like it) can be directly effected by the action the FCC. Here's where I'm coming from:

The Internet industry is a vibrant example of the disruptive nature of free markets, where new companies are able to compete with established ones almost overnight simply because they have immediate access to the exact same customer base. I have the potential reach every single one of Google user's right now if I create something that will draw them to me. This is the kind of dynamic industry I want to work in?that I want to \*create\* in.

If the Mr. Wheeler's proposed rules were adopted, it will tilt the playing field heavily in favor of established companies (more so than market inertia already does). Without paying extra fees to ISPs (beyond the fees payed to connect to the Internet in general), new companies would not have access to the same customer base as big, established companies. Those big, established companies would be able to spend their vast money reserves on priority access to ISPs' customers rather than on innovation to keep them ahead of a disruptive new startup. This kind of industry will drive me and others like me away. It would destroy the very fabric of the free market that is the neutral Internet.
