Dear Ms. Dortch:

By this letter, I am providing AT&T Mobility's ("AT&T") final status update regarding our readiness to provide text-to-911 service. AT&T's text-to-911 service is now available on a nationwide basis for PSAPs to request.¹ As indicated in previous updates, AT&T has received many requests for text-to-911 service in advance of today's date. We are currently reaching out to these PSAPs, and will be coordinating the turn-up of their service requests with Intrado, our Text Control Center (TCC) vendor. Pending verification of any applicant PSAP's readiness to receive text messages, we expect to turn up future PSAP requests in a reasonable amount of time, which is consistent with the terms of our voluntary commitment.² Finally, should it be helpful, I am attaching a copy of the form letter that we have been using to assist PSAPs requesting guidance as to what information should be included in their official requests for text-to-911 service.

In accordance with the Commission's rules, this letter and the attached presentation are being filed in the above-referenced dockets via the FCC's Electronic Comments Filing System.

¹ While the voluntary commitment did not include Aio Wireless and Cricket Wireless within its scope, Aio and Cricket are also ready to receive requests for text-to-911 service. However, as previously advised, we do not intend to upgrade Cricket's CMDA network to enable text-to-911 service.
