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I am very concerned about the fact that Clearchannel and Cumulus own nearly all of our nation's radio airwaves. It is my understanding that Cumulus has no liberal radio talk shows on any of its stations and that recently Clearchannel has removed just about all progressive radio programs from its stations inspite of the fact that many of these liberal programs have good ratings, that are in fact better than the programs that are replacing them. It is my understanding that the FCC has the power to regulate the content of radio shows in order to serve the public interest. How can having only one point of view (conservative) on the nation's public airwaves serve the public interest? In the past we had a "fairness doctrine" that enabled opposing points of view equal time on the public airwaves. Is the public interest being served when radio station owners have the power to control radio content by present only one political point of view? Does the FCC have the power to regulate this serious threat to our democracy?
