

Dear FCC:

I am writing to express my concerns regarding LMCC's Petition. It seems their rationale surrounding the argument that current licensees should be given a 6-month exclusivity to new frequencies completely contradicts the purpose of the FCC's decision to "open" the opportunity for consumers to be allowed ownership of 800 MHz spectrum. From reading the LMCC Petition, it is apparent they are advocating a monopoly for current licensee holders.

Therefore, allowing any window, let alone a 6-month window, for existing 800 MHz operators to apply for EB/GB frequencies creates a barrier to entry for small businesses, veterans, minorities, and American citizens in general who value these frequencies as a great opportunity to offer emerging information technologies to commercial, consumer and government entities. For the aforementioned reasons, the Commission should DENY the LMCC Petition.
